Highlights from Spring/Summer 2025

Site Improvements

Spring Planting

We kicked off spring with a major native planting project! Starting in March, we began planting 1,850 native ephemerals and ferns around the property. We concentrated most of the planting around the River Greenway Trail's wooded areas in spaces that volunteers have removed large swathes of honeysuckle. See if you can spot them!

River Greenway

After knocking out the first round of planting, we decided to plant 400 large plugs along the River Greenway Trail. These plants were a mix of ornamental and native. They were installed around the newly planted trees as part of a more purposeful landscaping effort in our overflow parking lot area. They have really transformed the trail!



Programs & Events

- ★ We have hosted 21 programs and events since March, and seen 1,028 visitors!
- ★ Some popular programs, like our House Wren Box, Recycled Oriole Feeder, and Bat House Workshops, made another appearance.
- ★ We also hosted some brand new programs, such as our Birds, Bees, & Beyond: Building a Backyard Habitat, Hummingbird Yard Art, and Hummingbird Banding programs.
- ★ Our most popular program this spring was our Rain Barrel Kit--we sold 40 kits! This program had a lot of buzz this year. It will definitely be back again!
- ★ Our most popular program this summer was our Nature Play Day--over 90 kids and parents came out to play and explore at the EEC!

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Spring Programs



House Wren Box Workshop

This popular program returned this spring! Participants learned all about house wrens, including their life history and habitats. Afterwards, participants assembled their very own house wren box to take home and install in their own backyard!



Birds, Bees, & Beyond: Building a Backyard Habitat



This program is the perfect way to kick off spring! Participants learned about a variety of ways to support local wildlife right in their own backyard. It doesn't take much to provide vital resources to our local insects, birds, and other critters and this program helps generate ideas for all sizes of spaces. Not only that, but participants also got a packet of native seeds to get their garden project started!

Easter Egg Hunt

Our annual Easter Egg Hunt took visitors all over the site searching for pastel painted wooden eggs. Almost all eggs were found this year! Successful searchers got to take home a bag full of Easter- and nature-themed goodies!

Recycled Oriole Feeder Workshop

This popular workshop was back again! Participants learned all about the life cycle of orioles and how to attract them to their own backyards. They also built their very own oriole feeder to take home and set up for future feathered visitors!



Beginner Birder Series

This was a brand new series! We had a great group of birders who came out each month to learn about local and migratory birds, hike the trails to spot some feathered friends, learn the tools of the trade, and dive into a fun hobby!

They got to start off strong with their very own bird ID guide book and a pair of binoculars



Rain Garden & Rain Barrel Workshop

Rain gardens and rain barrels are a great way to save water! Rain barrels sold out very quickly this year, keep an eye out for more in spring!

Hummingbird Yard Art Workshop



This new program combined art and education! Participants learned about the migratory Ruby-throated Hummingbird before creating a mosaic homage using upcycled tile and ceramics. This was a ton of fun, not to mention super popular! Registration for this program quickly sold out!

Summer Programs

Nature Play Days

Our annual summer Nature Play Days are always a hit, but this year we had more visitors than ever before!

These drop-in programs offer a fantastic variety of fun activities--games, crafts, hikes, and more!--to keep kids engaged outdoors.

Visitors enjoyed messy fun in the mud kitchen, creating nature framed art, doodling with sidewalk chalk, playing games, and all sorts of other fun activities!



Bat House Workshop

This is one of our most popular programs each year! We often host back-to-back workshops to keep up with demand.

Participants learn all about local, native bats--their life cycles, habits, and the health of local populations.

Afterwards, they build their very own bat house to take home with them.



Junior Indiana Master Naturalist Day Camp

Leaf Casting Workshop

This program is a fun one! Participants get to combine their love of exploring nature with their love of crafting!

Hummingbird Banding Workshop

This program was another first! We invited Allen Chartier from Great Lakes HummerNet to lead this exciting new opportunity. Participants learned about the HummerNet research project and opportunities to participate, as well as hints on how to attract and feed hummingbirds at home and hummingbird-friendly gardening tips.

Not only that, but participants also got to see a banding demonstration with hummingbirds caught at the Elkhart Environmental Center!



Fishing Clinic


Our 4th annual Kids Free Fishing Clinic was another huge success!

The event ran from 8 AM to 12 PM and saw over 426 kids and family members come out to complete the 1-hour clinic and earn a free rod and reel. Participants learned about basic tackle, conservation and stewardship, casting, local fish and habitat, knot tying, and (new this year!) water safety.

Stations were led by volunteers as well as staff from the Elkhart Environmental Center and the Aquatic Biology, Parks & Recreation, and Fire Departments.

We are especially grateful for volunteers who gave up most of their Saturday to support this event! Volunteers arrived before the event began to help with setup and complete an orientation and some stayed to help with cleanup (which meant that some volunteers were there for least 6 hours straight!). This event is a long day for volunteers and we are so grateful for those who are generous enough to share so much of their time and skills with our community.

Volunteer Highlights: Spring/Summer

TREE PREP DAY

The most popular part of our Earth Day event, the free tree giveaway, is also the one that takes the most prep work! This year, to make things easier for volunteers and for tree-adopters, we decided to bundle the tree roots in wood chips to keep them hydrated and make them easier to carry.

Volunteers came out on chilly, rainy afternoon to help prep all 500 trees that we had ordered for the event. **We had an unexpected turnout of over 20 volunteers who prepped all 500 trees in under 3 hours!**



Rods and Reels Prep Day

We love being able to give away free rods and reels to kids who complete the Kids Free Fishing Clinic! It is especially neat to see kids fishing with their new rods and reels around High Dive Pond just after completing all of the stations. But it would not be possible to provide these free gifts without help from volunteers.

Two days before the Fishing Clinic, volunteers gathered at High Dive Pavilion to assemble the rods and reels. They ran the fishing line and knotted hooks on each one and carefully stacked them for transport to the event. **They prepped 400 reels in under 3 hours!**

Volunteers also bundled bags of bobbers, weights, and hooks to give away at the event alongside the rods.

Our events not be possible without our volunteers. They also wouldn't be nearly as special or impactful.

Our annual Quilt Garden planting is a BIG project! It takes several hours to trace out the design, drill the holes, divide and plant the flowers, fertilize, and clean it all up.

This year, we had some extra helping hands who sped the process up. **We were able to completely install the quilt garden in 1 day, shaving off about 5 hours from last year!**

Not only that, but volunteers also helped weed the garden and replace dead plants throughout the season, keeping the design fresh.



We are always battling invasive plants. We had many wonderful volunteers who helped remove invasive plants from our rain garden and newly blooming native wildflower prairie. **They helped remove poison hemlock, Japanese hops, dame's rocket and more all through the hot summer months!**

Earth Day



We kicked off spring with our annual Earth Day event!

Visitors explored info booths, held live fish from the Elkhart River (courtesy of our Aquatic Biology Department), enjoyed kids activities, brought home new plants from the Spring Seeds & Starters Plant Exchange and—new this year!—made a FREE bluebird box! At our most popular activity, the free tree giveaway, we gave away around 471 trees (22 different kinds!).

Pollinator Promenade

We had a blast hosting our first annual Pollinator Promenade event!

The event featured fun competitions around our newly planted 4 acre wildflower prairie, as well as exhibitor and vendor booths, a food truck, and kids activities and games. Visitors competed in a speed walking race, scavenger hunt, and costume contest where 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners received native plants as prizes.

We had some amazing help from volunteers (many of whom dressed up as well!). Volunteers helped set up spaces for the exhibitor and vendor booths, kids area, and the judges table around the prairie and helped put everything away after the event ended. Volunteer judges provided Gatorade and water to competitors and collaborated to name the winners of the costume contest. We were so delighted to have so many excited volunteers helping kick off this brand new event!

Despite the heat, the event drew in around 75 visitors. We're looking forward to growing the event next year!

Whose Tracks Are Those?

Opossum Tracks

Recognizable for resemblance to human hand prints


Fun Fact: Opossums are Indiana's only native marsupial (mammal that raises its young in a pouch)



Coyote

Generally 2.5 -3.5 in long. Sometimes the 2 middle claws will make an imprint

Fun Fact: Coyotes are omnivorous and will eat grasses, fruits, and berries in summer and fall months



Wild Turkey

Massive tracks measure around 3.75 - 5 inches in length

Fun Fact: Although male turkeys can weigh up to 25 lbs. and females up to 12.5 lbs., turkeys can reach up to 60 mph when flying



Our Winter Owls

Winter is an excellent time to listen for owls that are around the area. Most of these are year-round residents in our area with the exception of the Snowy, Long-eared, and Short-eared Owls. Scan the QR Code by each bird to listen to its call.



Great Horned Owl

Length: 18.1-24.8 in
Wingspan: 39.8-57.1 in
Weight: 32.1-88.2 oz
(That's 2-5.5 lbs or the weight of an average cantaloupe!)



Barred Owl

Length: 16.9-19.7 in
Wingspan: 39.0-43.3 in
Weight: 16.6-37.0 oz
(That's 1-2.3 lbs or the weight of a quart of grapes!)



Barn Owl

Length: 12.6-15.8 in
Wingspan: 39.4-49.2 in
Weight: 14.1-24.7 oz
(That's 0.88-1.5 lbs or the weight of two medium oranges!)



Eastern Screech-Owl

Length: 6.3-9.8 in
Wingspan: 18.9-24.0 in
Weight: 4.3-8.6 oz
(That's 0.27-0.54 lbs or the weight of an average apple!)



Northern Saw-whet Owl

Length: 7.1-8.3 in
Wingspan: 16.5-18.9 in
Weight: 2.3-5.3 oz
(That's 0.14-0.33 lbs or the weight of a small stack of envelopes!)



Snowy Owl

Length: 20.5-27.9 in
Wingspan: 49.6-57.1 in
Weight: 56.4-104.1 oz
(That's 3.5-6.5 lbs or the weight of 2 quarts of juice!)



Long-eared Owl

Length: 13.8-15.8 in
Wingspan: 35.4-39.4 in
Weight: 7.8-15.3 oz
(That's 0.49-0.96 lbs or the weight of two pears!)



Short-eared Owl

Length: 13.4-16.9 in
Wingspan: 33.5-40.5 in
Weight: 7.3-16.8 oz
(That's 0.46-1.05 lbs or the weight of an average paperback book!)
