



## Fall Campaign Project

The Center for Community Justice's Fall Campaign is focused on essential facility and technology improvements to strengthen our capacity to serve the community and ensure a safe, welcoming environment for all who access our programs. A key component of this campaign is the window replacement project, which will significantly improve the physical condition and energy efficiency of our facility. By enhancing comfort, safety, and visual appeal, the project directly contributes to the revitalization of the Elkhart Urban Enterprise Association and supports the ongoing operation and growth of our organization. These upgrades create a more welcoming environment for staff, volunteers, and community members accessing our restorative justice and support services, thereby strengthening our capacity to provide employment opportunities and community-based programming. In doing so, the project aligns with the EUEA's mission by improving the quality of life for residents, fostering economic stability, and supporting the long-term sustainability of a community-centered organization within Elkhart County.

In addition to the replacement of the windows, the Fall Campaign also includes the side porch and steps, upgrades to our phone and internet services, and technology improvements, including the integration of newly donated computers, laptops, iPads, and software upgrades. These improvements collectively enhance safety, increase operational efficiency, and modernize our communication and technology infrastructure, further enabling the CCJ to provide high-quality services to the community.

Window Spec: ProVia white vinyl Double Hungs & Picture windows, fusion welded main frame & sash, double pane annealed High Performance LowE with Argon glass, white window hardware & tilt latches, 1/2 screens, NO grills,

Installation: prep jobsite with drop clothes & other precautions as needed, remove old sashes & stops as needed for insert replacement, prep openings, install new vinyl window, wrap exterior sills & casings with White coil stock, caulk/seal exterior, insulate, white shoe mould on interior as needed, confirm smooth operation of sashes/screen/hardware, haul away all trash and old units, clean up jobsite.


